MINISTER'S MESSAGE

A friend of mine, writing on Facebook at the beginning of December, encouraged her friends: "Remember, you drive your season. You choose how to spend your time in Advent and Christmas." Although she appeared to be offering advice to her friends with busy and hectic lives, I expect she was mostly reminding herself to be intentional about her own choices during this very special, but very full, season of the year.

Family, friends, work, church commitments, and social functions can fill up our schedules and keep us running from one thing to the next; or we can choose to forego some activities and savour some others, allowing the joy and peace of the season enough time and space to settle in our hearts.

This Christmas I encourage you also to be intentional about how you celebrate. If you decide to host a dinner or have a party, to send cards or give presents, to make a special donation to a charity, to volunteer your time or talent for a good cause, or if you decide to attend a special worship service or add a devotional practice for Advent... then do these things because doing them is meaningful for you or allows you to express love and care for others. Don't do them because you think you HAVE to do them. Don't do them because you ALWAYS do them at Christmas or because you think that everyone is SUPPOSED to do them.

A number of years ago I really cut down on the practice of buying a lot of Christmas presents. I have to admit it was easier for me to do this because I don't have any kids and my extended family lives quite far away. Some years Nick and I didn't buy any presents at all, and other years we would just get something small for each other – some good books to read over the holiday, for example. And I have to admit that it's been several years since we've put up a Christmas tree at home. We were busy with church activities and hardly home, so we wouldn't have really appreciated a tree that much.

But this Christmas I want to put up a Christmas tree. Not a really big one, but one that we can decorate together, cover with lights, and sit by in the living room while we read, pray, and experience this holy season. I think it's going to be wonderful!

I hope that as you make your Christmas plans you will include some time for worship and drawing close to God. Jesus is the reason for the season. It is his birth that we celebrate, and his coming again that we anticipate. Perhaps the following prayer may be helpful for your reflection:

CAN TABS FOR HOSPITALS

If you have any tabs at home please bring them to the church. Funds raised by the hospital go towards purchasing wheel chairs.

The History of the Can Tab: As the story goes, the collection of can tabs started as a hoax at a Legion in Ontario in 1988. Through persistence, those who had been "hoaxed" found a buyer for their aluminum tabs and they used the proceeds to purchase a wheelchair the following year. The idea took hold across the country and others started collecting tabs.

Initially, the Pasqua Hospital Auxiliary collected the tabs and purchased 19 wheelchairs for the front entrance of the hospital. Eventually these chairs were moved to the wards, so they could be cleaned and "owned" by the wards. The auxiliary then purchased a bank of wheelchairs that is housed at the front entrance.

In a ten-year period of collecting tabs, the Auxiliary has raised just over \$10,000 – not enough to buy a wheelchair. The cost of a specialty type of wheelchair (bariatic or broda) has gone up dramatically. Therefore, our funding from the tabs is no longer kept separate but goes into general funds that are donated to the Hospitals of Regina Foundation "Wish List" for needed equipment.
