

Sunday, June 12 is Truth and Reconciliation Sunday at First Church. Guest preacher Rev. Stewart Folster will tell us about his work at Saskatoon Native Circle Ministry. Stewart, a Presbyterian minister is Ojibway. His Christian ministry in Saskatoon is informed by his indigenous spirituality. In a recent Star Phoenix interview he said, "I follow both, but I don't blend the two. They are not in opposition. The God of the Bible and the Creator God of Native spirituality are one and the same. But now we tell people He has a Son, Jesus Christ." We look forward to hearing from Stewart about his ministry in inner-city Saskatoon, work that First Church has supported through special offerings for two years.

3rd annual Memorial Walk & Feast for Regina Indian Industrial School takes place on Wednesday, July 27 from noon to 4 pm. All are welcome to participate in this day of remembering the children buried at the RIIS cemetery and the others who died at the school. First Church has been collaborating with church and community partners in the preservation of this space and honouring the children. The short walk to the cemetery site is followed by a traditional memorial feast. It's a great way to learn about aboriginal healing and the churches'
