MINISTER'S MESSAGE

As we continue through the season, you're invited to use the Lent Devotional, "Singing through Lent and Easter" and join the devotional group that is meeting on Thursdays from 12:30-1:30 pm in the Morris Room (or by Zoom). We'll be using a wide variety of hymns and songs inform our reflection, lift our spirits, and draw us close to God as we journey towards Easter.

Some of you will probably choose to attend the Lent Devotional group because you always come to the seasonal studies and discussion groups that we have at First Church. I'm thankful for your faithfulness and all that you contribute to our shared learning and reflection!

But I wonder if some others might choose to attend the group this Lent, not because it's Lent, but because you want to gather in Christian community to pray and care for each other during a difficult time.

Come folks in our community are going through a difficult time because of personal challenges, illness or injury, loss or grief, or other stresses and strains in work or family life. But we're all going through a difficult time because of politics and international relations that are affecting Canada in significant new ways.

Canadians are very used to wars, conflicts, and difficulties in other parts of the world, and we

expect our nation to advocate for justice, contribute to peace keeping, and stand together with nations of good will who are trying to make the world a better place. But in my lifetime, I have not experienced the current level of aggression, economic pressure, and threats against our country of Canada.

At the same time, my prayers are not only for Canadians, but for so many Americans who are being hurt by the current Administration's drastic cuts, job losses, reversals of DEI policies, removal of supports for vulnerable people, and deportation of so many undocumented people.

My heart breaks for the people of Ukraine, for people living in Gaza, and for people in so many countries being impacted by radical cuts to USAID programs.

We are living in deeply unsettling and dangerous times in which we need to be paying attention, speaking up, advocating for justice, and caring for one another. We need each other. We need our faith. We need to remember that God is with us, that Jesus shows us the way, and the Holy Spirit will empower us to do, and say, and be what is needed in the weeks and months ahead. We also need to pray for our leaders in Canada and for leaders around the world.

Here is a prayer for the world community which we can pray and share together. It comes from The Presbyterian Church USA, a sister denomination to our own.

Almighty God, in Jesus Christ you have ordered us to live as loving neighbours. Though we are scattered in different places, speak different words, or descend from different races, give us common concern, so that we may be one people, who share the governing of the world under your guiding purpose. May greed, war, and lust for power be curbed, and all people enter the community of love promised in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Ecumenical Statement of Solidarity with Palestinian and Israeli Partners

KAIROS, church leaders, and heads of church agencies have signed an ecumenical statement in solidarity with Palestinian and Israeli partners, calling on the international community to hold Israel and Hamas accountable for their violations of international law. Appalled by the Trump Administration's statements supporting ethnic cleansing and further forced displacement in Gaza, this ecumenical statement urges all Canadians to act in support of the human rights and dignity of Palestinians and in opposition to continuing violations of their legal, civil and human rights by the Israeli government and its allies.

In it, they write:

"Words are not enough. We call on church members to continue to pray and act for peace. We urge church members to share their concerns for human rights, international law, and a just peace in the Middle East with their elected leaders and with those seeking public office. We call on member churches, church constituents and all Canadians to amplify the calls of churches, faith leaders, civil society organizations and partners in the region for just peace, human dignity and international law, with strength and with urgency."

AN ECUMENICAL DEVOTIONAL TOWARDS ANTI-RACISM

The Commission on Justice and Peace (CJP), an ecumenical body within the Canadian Council of Churches, has released a devotional resource entitled *Journeys to the Well – An Ecumenical Devotional Towards Anti-Racism*. This devotional addresses racism as a central issue for the church.

The contributors, most of whom are Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour, are from diverse denominations, ages, and locations across Canada. They were invited to reflect on self-selected scriptures and their personal experiences and a minimal editing approach was taken to centre the authors' authentic voices.

The devotional aims to connect faith with antiracism action, encouraging readers to engage with scripture and prayer as a foundation for working towards racial justice. It is intended for flexible use, allowing readers to engage with the reflections in whatever way resonates with them.
